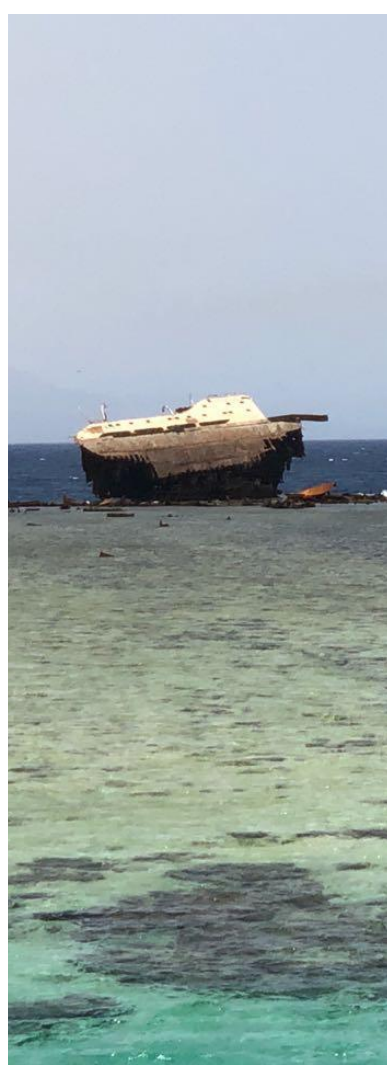

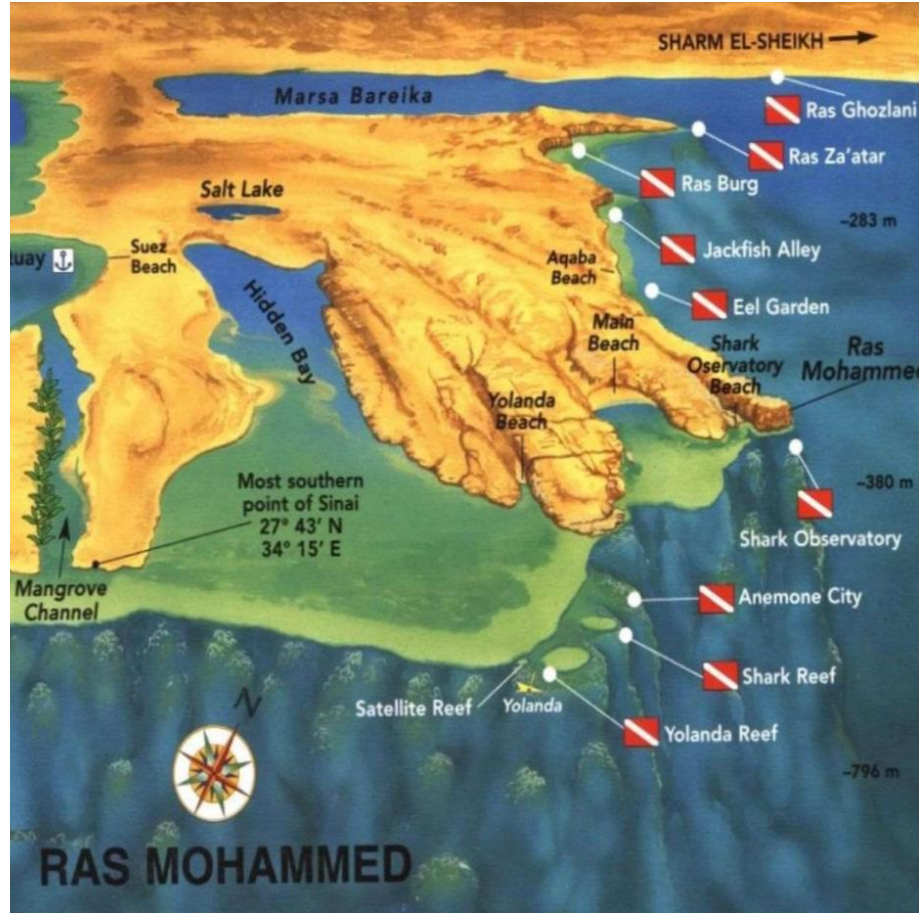
Don't miss the Straits of Tiran reefs, where the crystal-clear waters invite you to explore iconic sites like Jackson Reef, perfect for underwater photography.

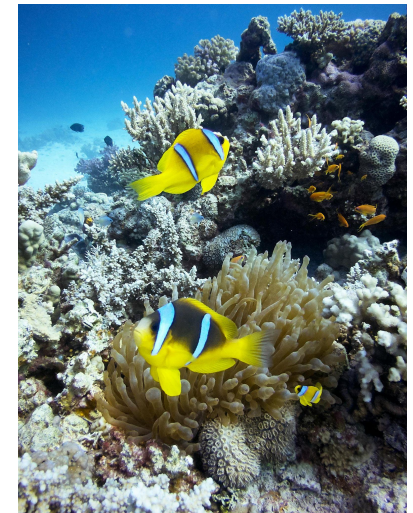
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Ras Mohammed National Park

South of the Sinai Peninsula lies Ras Mohammed, Egypt's first protected national park since 1983. Initially covering 97 km², the park has expanded to 480 km². Due to its great beauty and scientific importance, the park is exceptionally well-preserved thanks to local awareness and ongoing surveillance from both land and sea.

Among all the dive sites in the park, the most notable are Shark & Yolanda Reef and Jack Fish Alley. Here, we'll discover the immense and colorful marine life that awaits in one of the best areas of Egypt's northern Red Sea route.

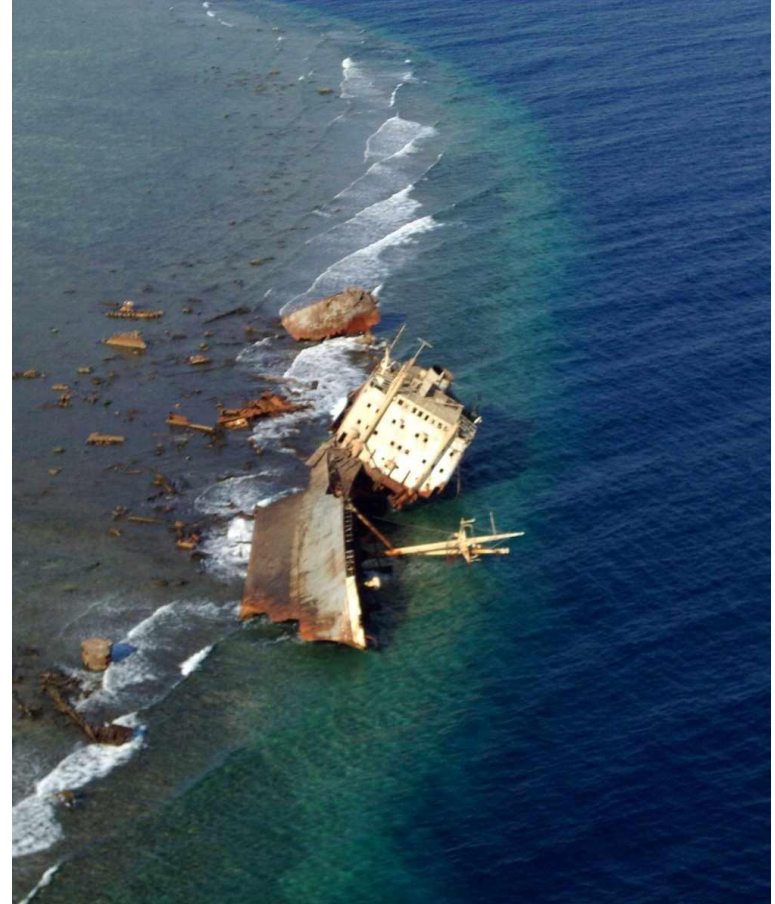


Straits of Tiran

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The Straits of Tiran is one of the most iconic diving areas in the Red Sea, located between the Sinai Peninsula and Tiran Island. This strait is famous for its spectacular marine biodiversity and stunning coral reefs.

Among the most well-known reefs are Jackson Reef, where breathtaking coral walls await you. Enjoy the beauty of Wood House Reef, with its vibrant coral gardens and turtles. At Gordon Reef, you'll encounter a variety of fish in a spectacular setting.

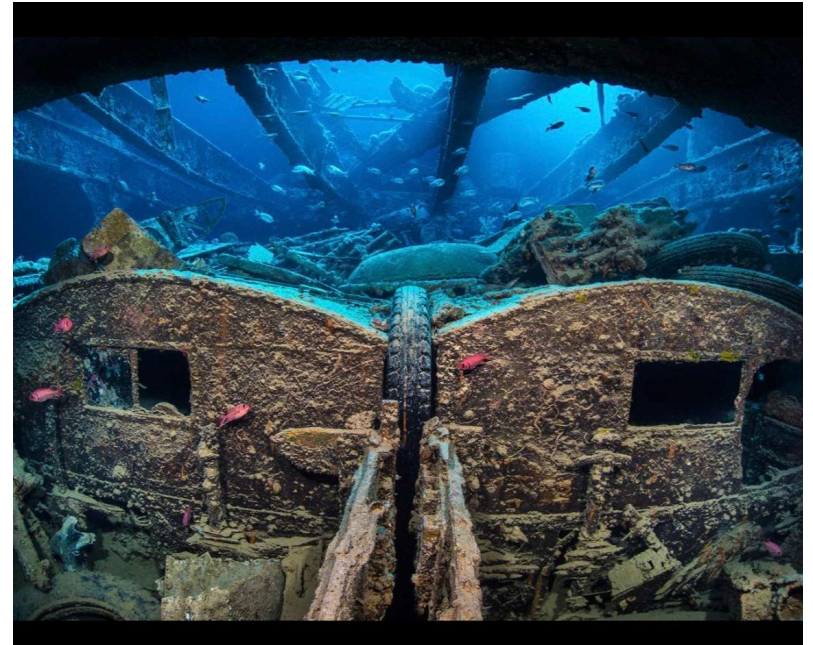


Thistlegorm

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The Thistlegorm is considered one of the best wreck dives in the world and an experience you won't want to miss. Sunk in 1941 during World War II, this British cargo ship offers a fascinating connection to history as you explore the remains of military vehicles and supplies.

At around 30 meters deep, you can explore the deck and interior, finding trucks and motorcycles covered in colorful corals. The marine life is incredible, with schools of fish and turtles adding to the excitement of each dive.



Carnatic - Giannis - Ulysses

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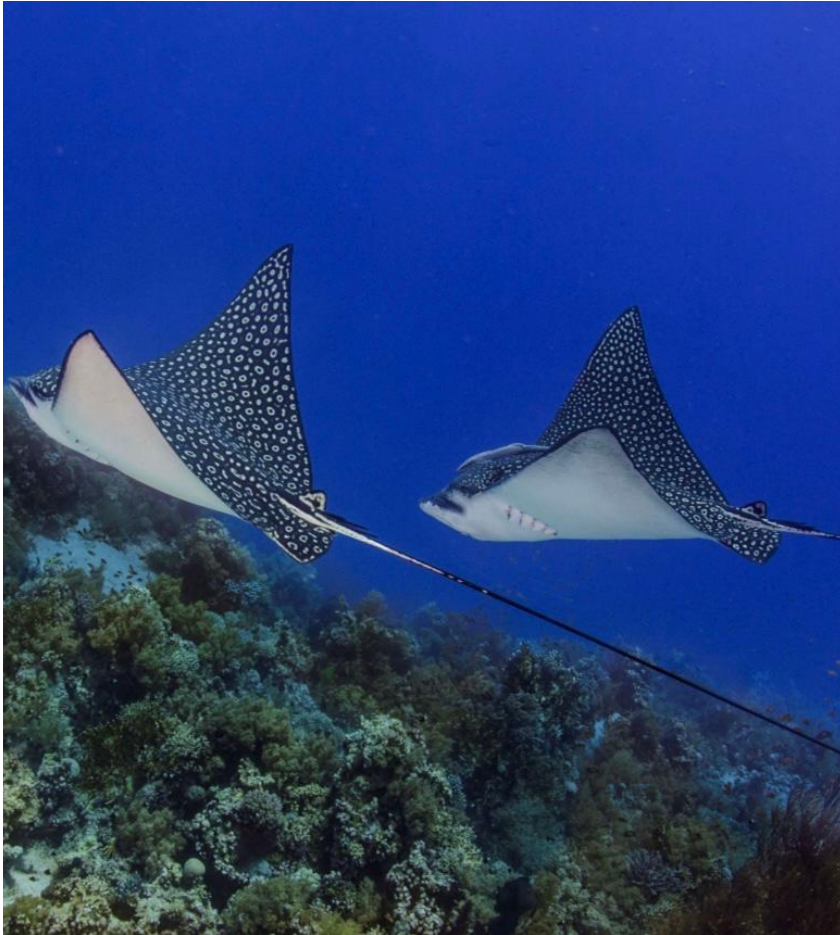
Abu Nuhas is famous not only for its impressive biodiversity but also for the shipwrecks that rest in its waters. Each wreck has its own story, such as the Carnatic, sunk in 1869, offering remains of ceramics and abundant marine life. The Giannis D, which sank in 1983, stands out for its excellent preservation and encounters with sharks. Lastly, the Ulysses, sunk in 1986, is home to vibrant corals and turtles.



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Hurghada Reefs

We will also dive in the reefs near Hurghada, which offer a wide variety of dive sites, where we'll explore walls adorned with coral gardens teeming with tropical fish.



Itinerary

DAY 1 Arrival, check-in, general briefing, dinner. First night spent on board in the Marina.

DAY 2 Check dive, second dive, night dive, then sail to Ras Mohammed.

DAY 3 Dive at Ras Mohammed: Shark & Yolanda Reef, Shark Observatory, Ras Umm El Sid, night dive at Temple. Then sail to Tiran.

DAY 4 Dive at Jackson Reef, Wood House, Gordon Reef. Night dive. Then sail to Bacon Rock.

DAY 5 Dive at Dunraven, Thistlegorm, Thistlegorm, then sail to Abu Nuhas.

DAY 6 Dive at Giannis D, Carnatic, Yellow reef, night dive then sail to Hurghada area.

DAY 7 Dive at Sha'ab El Erg, Careless Reef, then back to the Marina.

DAY 8 Breakfast and check-out.

Booking and Cancellation Conditions

We require a 25% deposit of the total price to confirm the reservation.

The remaining balance must be paid via bank transfer at least 1 month before the safari start date.

In case of cancellation, the following fees will be deducted:

- 61-90 days before the arrival date: 10% of the safari price
- 60-46 days before the arrival date: 25% of the safari price
- 45-30 days before the arrival date: 75% of the safari price
- 30 days or less before the arrival date: 100% of the safari price

FAQ

Do I need a visa to enter Egypt?

Yes, you will need a visa. Remember that your passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your arrival date. You can obtain the visa at the airport upon arrival, right after you leave the plane, and it costs 25 USD.

Do I need dive insurance?

Yes, dive insurance is mandatory. It can be purchased on board for 10 euros. The D.E.C.O card (Diving Emergency Center Organization) is valid for 2 weeks and covers the first hyperbaric chamber.

What diving equipment should I bring?

You should bring a dive computer, surface marker buoy (SMB), snorkel, regulator, BCD, mask, fins, and a wetsuit. We recommend bringing some spare parts.

If you need to rent equipment, please contact us before the trip.

Remember to also bring your diving certification and logbook, showing the number of dives you have completed.

What should I keep in mind?

It is strictly forbidden to hunt, fish, collect, touch corals or shells, throw anything into the sea, or feed fish. Gloves and knives are prohibited.

Violating these rules may result in the suspension of the crew and the boat from working for a period of time.
